

M King Egbertus. In the raigne of Brigthricus a little before mentioned, a= bout the year of grate 795, there was in his deminion a noble personage, of some called Egbert, of some Ethelbert, of fome Athelbright, who being feared of the fame Brighricus, because he was of a kingly bloud, anere unto the crowne, Resime. was by the force & conspiracie of the forenamed Brigthricus, chafed a purfued out of the land of Britain into frace, where he endured till the death of the fayd Brigthricus. Af= ter the hearing whereof, Egbert sped him editiones out of Fraunce, but his countrey of welliage, where he in inch wife behaued hunfelfe, that he obteined the regiment and

governance of the above and kingdom.

Bernulphus kingof Mercia aboue mentioned, with 0= ther kings, had this Egbert in such derivo, that they made of him divers fcoffing geltes, and fcoming rimes, at which he fulleined for a time. But when he was more established in his kingdome, shad proved the mindes of his fubjects and especially 1300 working withall: he afterward afferre bled his knights, and gaue to the latte Bernulphus, a bat= taile in a place called Elinde, in the pronince of haron. And notwithanding in that fight was great oddes of number, as s. b1 8. against one, pet Egbert (through the might of the Lord which glueth victory as pleaseth him) has the better and wan the field: which bone he scaled that Loid= thip into his hand. And that also done, he made war open the Acentith layous, and at length in likewife, of them obtained the victory. And as it is in Polychronicon teilified, he also subdued Aorthumberland, and caused the kings of these three kingdomes to line under him as tributaries or toyned them to his mingdome. Ex Flor. Hift. This Egbert, also wan from the Britons or wellhine, the rown of The= fer, which they had kept policition of, till that daye. After thele & other victories, he peaceably enjoying the land, called a Councell of his Lords at winchester, where by their adulles he was crowned king a chief Lord oner this land. which before that day was cailed Britaincibut the he feut out into all coasts of the land his commanuocments and comissions, charging straightly from that day so ward the Sarons should be called Angles, and the land Anglia.

About the 30. years of the raigns of Egbert, the heathes nish people of the Danes, which a little before had made horrible destruction in Porthumberland, a especially in p Me of Lindefarue, where they spoyled the Churches, and murrhered the ministers, with men, women, and children, after a cruell maner, entered now the second tyme with a second tyme engreat hold into this land, and spoyled the Ile of Shepy in Rent, or nere to Rent, where Egbert hearing theref, allembled his people and met with them at Carrum. But in that conflictived not so well as he was wont in tymes before, but with his knights was compelled to forlake the field. Morwithstanding in the next battail, the layd Egbert with a fmall power ouerthiew a great multitude of them, and so drove them backe.
